To provide information to assist members in the allocation of community grants to local organisations in 2024-25

Recommendation

Members agree the allocation of community grants for 2024-25 to organisations who have satisfied the Community Grants' Policy and Procedure

Report

- 1. For the financial year 2024-25, the council has set aside £15,000 to support local organisations with community fund grants.
- 2. Applications can be made for up to £1,000pa.
- 3. As per the community fund policy and procedure, applications were invited at the end of January 2024, with a deadline for submission of applications of 5pm on Monday 4 March 2024.
- 4. Public notices were placed in local newspapers, and on the council's website and social media inviting local organisations to apply for a community grant of up to £1,000.
- 5. By the deadline, 23 applications had been submitted. An application from Lyme Regis Business Association was later withdrawn, leaving 22 applications for members to consider. There were no late applications.
- 6. All organisations awarded a 2023-24 grant have submitted their end of project forms.
- 7. The following organisations have not yet claimed their 2023-24 grant, but they have until 31 March 2024 to do so: Lyme Heartbeat, Lyme Regis Boat Building Academy, Lyme Regis Community Support, the Town Mill Trust and Uplyme and Lyme Regis Cricket Club. Lyme Regis Youth Football has claimed some, but not all, of its grant thus far.
- 8. A spreadsheet detailing the 2024-25 applications is attached, **appendix 6A**. Applications have been listed in alphabetical order.
- 9. The total amount requested is £14,388.83, against a £15,000 budget.
- 10. Copies of all the application forms are attached, **appendices 5B to W.**

3. What are the main activities in which your organisation is involved?

Axminster and Lyme Cancer Support was founded in July 2018 by local people affected by cancer together with two local GPs to support people suffering from the disease and their families. Our aim is to provide support to anyone who needs it, when they need it, to improve physical and mental well-being and help them through their cancer journey. We aim to provide each client with a bespoke package of support when they need it, here in the local community.

Support includes drop-in sessions, counselling, 1-2-1 support, touch therapies, care packs and distraction aids to help through their cancer journey. We run a creative programme which includes floristry, silver smithing, art and creative writing, and a physical programme which includes Nordic walking, swimming, aquatherapy and horse riding.

We support clients in Lyme Regis, Dorset and Axminster, Devon and the surrounding villages. 50% of our clients are based in Dorset. All of our services are offered to our clients free of charge.

We continue to see an increased number of clients needing our support. Our #1 request for support continues to be for 1-1 counselling. We offer newly diagnosed clients 10 sessions of counselling (£375), and those post treatment 6 sessions of counselling (£225). We are requesting funding from LRTC to support clients based in Lyme Regis with counselling.

5. Who will benefit from the project and how?

With £1000 we are able to fund 4-5 Lyme Regis clients with 6-10 sessions of counselling. Counselling is very powerful in helping clients come to terms with a new diagnosis, move forward following treatment and sadly to support those with a terminal diagnosis.

What our clients say:

"I want to say a big thank you for the sessions with the counseller - she is wonderful and has really helped me to get on with life again. Thank you so much for all your support- it has enabled my body, heart and soul to catch up and refocus on the future"

Our clients are disadvantaged as they are affected by cancer. A diagnosis of cancer impacts every part of their lives – emotionally, physically and often financially.

Cobb Gate Junior Parkrun is a weekly, free timed run which takes place every Sunday morning on Gun Cliff Walk and along the sea wall. Parkrun encourages and sustains a healthy lifestyle and aims to get children interested in running and keeping fit at an early age. Junior Parkruns take place all over the country and are open to everyone, free forever and safe and easy to take part in. Parents and carers can take part too but won't receive a finishing position. Junior Parkrun is open to children aged 4 to 14 and they can run, jog, skip or hop, whatever they feel like doing! The Lyme Regis event was launched in February 2022 and on 10 March 2024 we will celebrate our 100th event!

> Parkrun as a movement is hugely popular, with events taking place around the world. We have lots of regulars who live locally and we get lots of visitors joining in, especially during the school holidays when they are on holiday in Lyme Regis and surrounding areas. Parkrun and Cobb Gate Junior Parkrun have their own websites but we would like to advertise the event more locally. Although Parkrun is a worldwide movement with over 3 million people taking part at least once, there are still many people who haven't heard of Parkun. We would like our Junior Parkrunners to take part in Lyme Regis Carnival to help spread the word about our event. To do this, we would like to have a banner made and provide all the children with something noisy (such as whistles and horns) to attract attention!

_ Any young person who sees our banner will benefit from knowing about Junior Parkrun and will then have the opportunity to take part. We also think this will be a great way for our regular runners and even visitors to get involved in a great community event like Lyme Regis Carnival.

- What are the main activities in which your organisation is involved? Little Green Change is a non-profit social enterprise providing environmental education and opportunities for primary and secondary-aged children, both directly in schools and in communities across the UK.

Our aim is to inspire, educate and facilitate action, benefitting both the planet and people. We do this through our educational Schools Programme, speaker talks, environmental events, competitions, projects, annual student magazine, awards ceremony and initiatives.

4. Please provide details of the project you require funding for. We are applying for funding as part of your Community Grants programme to purchase the items required to create a Little Green Change community stall, so that we can attend local fairs and community events in 2024 and beyond, and we can interact with local residents at these, helping to spread the word about the great environmental actions happening in Lyme Regis, Little Green Change's work in local schools and in the community, the Town Council's support of our activities, and the things children and adults can do to make little green change's in their own lives.

As well as community events organised by the Town Council, Little Green Change will attend events organised by the Lyme Regis Business Association (Clare Matheson is a member of the Executive Committee), and other local community organisations including Turn Lyme Green.

Who will benefit from the project and how?
 Our services and activities are targeted at children from age 5 up to age 18. Through the creation of a Little Green Change community stall, we will be able to interact with children,

their parents/carers, and additional residents and visitors who are keen to find out and/or support our environmental education work in the community and across state-funded schools. We estimate we will interact with at least 5,000 local residents and visitors in 2024, as a direct result of this funding. The worksheets we will get printed will provide an environmental education activity for kids, as well as informing children and adults about how they can get more involved in the free community and state-school activities we offer.

A few of the activities we have delivered since our launch on 1st September 2023 include:

- Environmental education actions in all of the schools within Lyme Regis (St Michael's CE VA Primary School, The Woodroffe School, & Mrs Ethelston's CE Primary Academy). We are continuing to work with them on additional actions over the coming months including tailored assemblies and wildlife habitats.
- Environmental events including bulb planting and eco pledge posters at Lyme Regis Library. We will be delivering a free seed sowing activity there over the Easter holiday.
- Our first Children's Christmas Give & Take event in Lyme Regis, directly helping 112 children. littlegreenchange.com/give-take.

I have enclosed some pictures of the area with gigs full of water – we have had occasions when one of the gigs has had nearly a foot of water in. The water is not good for the gigs, causing deterioration to the main hull and limiting the kit we can keep on board.. Removing the water before we move the gigs takes time and care and members often get wet just getting the gigs out of the cage area — which can be a health & safety risk during the cold weather months. We would like to put some form of roof over the gigs. We are restricted In what we can do – the owner of the building on the right (used, but not owned by the BBA) will not allow us to attach anything to the building and we are restricted to the space we rent from the

Town Council on the left hand side of the cage. This means we need to erect a 'temporary' freestanding structure. We would like to construct this from scaffolding with a corrugated tin roof (please see attached quote).

In the years 2022/2023 and 2023/2024 we have successfully applied for a grant of £500 towards the cost of organising a Workshop for brass players of all ages and abilities from Lyme Regis and the surrounding area. For the first one we engaged the professional services of musicians from the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra and for the second players from Flowers Band joined us. On both occasions these top class musicians spent the day with us sharing their expertise and providing first class tuition. Each workshop concluded with a short concert. Both workshops were a huge success, attended by musicians from brass bands across the south west.

Building on our previous success we are now planning a third workshop on 26th October this year and this time we are in correspondence with two nationally acclaimed bands to see if we can engage the services of some of their talented musicians. We are confident that this year's event will be as successful as our previous workshops, if not more so, and will be just as worthwhile and advantageous to those attending as well as promoting Lyme Regis as a centre of music excellence!

5. Who will benefit from the project and how?

All those who have attended previous workshops have benefitted from the expertise provided and we also hope to use this event to recruit new players into the Lyme Regis

Town Band. In addition our future audiences will be able to enjoy a more varied programme of music, to an improved standard, due to the increased ability of our players following the expert training they will receive. Finally the town of Lyme Regis will gain by the publicity and goodwill associated with the event.

Your previous generous donations to our Garden Project have enabled us to completely re-vitalise our outside play area by laying an all-weather play surface. The children can now play outside all year round, whatever the weather, and it has been a huge success with the children.

We would now like to extend their learning opportunities in this area, to progress on from play and fill the area with more learning resources. We would like to expand their interest in nature by using our raised beds to plant seeds and vegetables; set up outdoor problem-solving activities, e.g. water pipe and guttering play; and develop their agility with stepping stones, balancing planks and climbing cubes.
