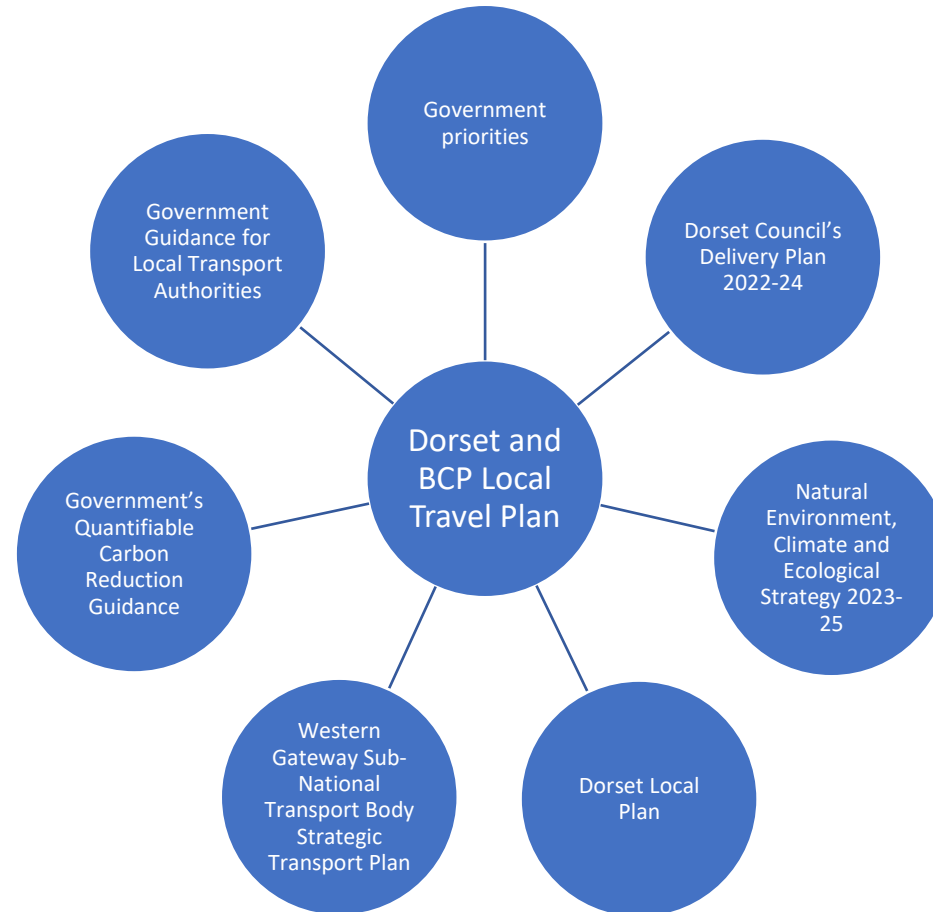


# Dorset and BCP joint Local Transport Plan 4 development

# Summary

- Current local transport plan (LTP3) published in 2011 and runs until 2026
- Dorset Council and BCP are currently 'planning' for the Local Transport Plan (LTP) for 2026 - 2041
- The new LTP will:
  - set out a long-term vision for moving around Dorset safely and sustainably
  - align with government policy
  - make the strategic case for transport investment
- The aim is to adopt the plan in Spring 2025

# Approach

- A move away from 'predict and provide' model, i.e., historic traffic and socio-economic trends to determine future infrastructure needs
- A move towards a vision-led approach to planning, i.e., the outcomes to be achieved and how to deliver these
- Plus, better alignment to Dorset and BCP Council's Local Plans

# Natural Environment, Climate & Ecological Implications

- Walking, cycling, wheeling and public transport become 1<sup>st</sup> choice option
- Integration of travel and spacial planning along with the roll-out of digital infrastructure and services
- Delivering infrastructure to support alternative fuels and EV charging
- Produce a quantified carbon baseline and analysis of carbon emissions
- Consider impact of transport on the natural environment and biodiversity
