

## **OUR FUTURE TOWNS UPDATE**

#### **Current & Next Steps**

- Collating feedback and responses to "Our Findings So Far" document
- Developing a prototype toolkit to then test with communities and stakeholders
- Understanding the barriers of change from different perspectives
- Reaching out to schools and forming wider relationships with the town
- Improved communication via group workshops to test prototypes and gain further feedback

#### **Open Source Results**

Our objectives are to create;

- active discussions and engagement in the possible solution for the town, and not just bringing up the problems
- a toolkit of communication representing the changes the town have prioritised in terms of place-making and transport planning

#### **Stakeholder Input**

We're designing tools for communities to represent / communicate / reimagine their future towns, based of the knowledge of our common futures. So people of the town are part of the changes that take place. It is a communication project that has a focus on system and mind set change.

How best would you receive this piece of communication in order to most effectively make tangible decisions, including;

- changes
- to decide if it's unfeasible or feasible
- to send it over to other stakeholders such as county council / highways / developers etc.

We understand different types of change require different amounts and types of effort / money / barriers / people involved. But who and what are they?

#### **Holistic View**

We want part of the knowledge we give the community to include a more holistic view of what these barriers are and how, as a community, they might be a stepping stone along the way to secure funding / implementation for change.

#### **Key Questions**

- If communities want to engage in the decisions of their future towns, what is the current process that takes place?

- How do they communicate this?
- How often do these communications take place?
- Who does it go through within the Town Council?
- What is the process that decides whether or not it will be implemented? And who decides this, and how is it decided?
- How is this outcome communicated back to the community?

### We Want to Understand Your Barriers

What are the common barriers you face when implementing change;

- lack of funding in which case how do you decide what to prioritise?
- highways / county council has the power in which case how do you progress?
- lack of community support for the idea
- feasibility studies come back negative

We want to make a collection of mechanisms that can be used to create change, including;

- policy at town council level
- private sector funding
- policy at national level

#### **For Communities**

Complaints and changes;

- If you had a complaint about the town how would you go about communicating this / changing this?

Those who HAVE envisioned the towns future;

- If you have had a vision for how you would like your future town to be, who have you communicated this to?
- How have you communicated it?
- How far did this idea get?
- What skills did you use to further this idea?
- What obstacles did you have in furthering this idea?

Those who HAVEN'T envisioned the towns future;

- If you haven't had a holistic vision of your future town. Why is this?
- Would you like to be part of creating a wholistic vision of your town's future?
- If people knew they were going to be asked, they might start thinking about it more regularly- like an annual community event to reimagine future town or street events.
