Title: Allocation of Community Grants 2021/22

Purpose of Report

To provide information to assist members in the allocation of community grants to local organisations in 2021/22

Recommendation

Members agree the allocation of community grants for 2021/22 to organisations who have satisfied the Community Grants' Policy and Procedure

Background

- 1. On 13 November 2019, the Strategy and Finance Committee considered a report on future grant allocations. It was subsequently resolved by the Full Council on 20 November 2019 'to set the total amount of grants to local organisations in 2020/21, 2021/22, 2022/23, 2023/24 and 2024/25 at £80,000 per year'.
- 2. At the same committee meeting, members discussed the grant categories and agreed proposals would be brought back to members to replace the minor/medium/major grants with a 'social fund' and 'discretionary grants'.
- 3. On 17 December 2019, the Strategy and Finance Committee considered a further report on grants. It was subsequently resolved by the Full Council on 8 January 2020 to approve the introduction of term grants with a budget of £60,000 and community grants with a budget of £20,000.
- 4. The processes and timetables for inviting grant applications and making decisions on their allocation was also agreed.
- 5. At the Full Council meeting on 8 January 2020, members approved policies and procedures for both grant categories.
- 6. An extraordinary Full Council meeting was held on 4 February 2020 to consider term grant applications. At that meeting, terms grants were awarded to seven organisations, with a funding commitment of £60,000pa in years one to three, and a commitment of £53,000 in years four and five.
- 7. At the Full Council meeting on 25 November 2021, the 2021/22 budget was approved. Due to budget constraints and the need to make savings, the community grants' budget was reduced from £20,000 to £15,000 in 2021/22.

Report

8. As per the agreed timetable, public notices were placed in local newspapers, and the council's website, social media and noticeboards inviting local organisations to apply for a community

- grant of up to £1,000 for 2021/22. Previous grant recipients were also written to and provided with an application pack.
- 9. The closing date for applications was 5pm on Monday 8 March 2021, by which time, 16 applications had been submitted.
- 10. A spreadsheet detailing the applications is attached, **appendix 5A**. Applications have been listed in alphabetical order.
- 11. The total amount requested is £13,233.99, against a £15,000 budget.
- 12. One of the council's requirements is that all organisations who receive a grant must submit an end of project form. All organisations in receipt of a 2020/21 grant and have also submitted an application for 2021/22 have submitted this form.
- 13. Members have also requested to be informed of which organisations have not claimed their grants. Both Turn Lyme Regis/Plastic Free Lyme Regis and Lyme Regis Majorettes have informed officers they would not be claiming their 2020/21 grant as Covid restrictions meant they could not carry out their projects. Both organisations have made new applications for 2021/22.

	We support anyone who is, or has been, affected by enabling them to cope with the challenges and stres support is tailored to each person depending on the	ses that this disease imposes. Our individual

enabling them to cope with the challenges and stresses that this disease imposes. Our individual support is tailored to each person depending on their needs and can include counselling, complementary therapies to relieve symptoms or exercise programmes. We also deliver weekly drop-in sessions (currently held virtually) where clients can connect with others who share their experiences, worries and concerns and where we can sign-post them to allied services that may better meet their needs (for example, financial help). Our regular workshops provide targeted sessions to promote healthier living and ways to improve physical and mental well-being; examples are fermented foods, mindfulness, sleep and yoga. We also run creative writing workshops and art sessions where people can express themselves in a non-verbal format. All our support is offered to clients free of charge.

Please provide details of the project you require funding for

We have discovered that creative activities have a beneficial calming effect on clients, particularly for those who are continuing to isolate due to the pandemic. In the coming twelve months, we are planning to offer four sessions each of four creative workshops for 20 clients (160 people in total):

- Art (£250 per session = £1,000)
- Creative writing (£150 per session = £600)
- Card-making (£150 per session = £600)
- Floristry (£450 per session = £1,800)

We have successfully delivered these workshops virtually using Zoom video conferencing although we hope to deliver them at a venue where people can interact in person as Covid-19 restrictions are lifted.

5. Who will benefit from the project and how?

Anyone who is registered in our community as receiving active cancer care, and their relatives or carers, are eligible to take part in these workshops. It will improve mental well-being and provide a forum to meet other people, even virtually, where thoughts and experiences can be shared in a friendly and understanding environment. From feedback already received from our previous art and creative writing courses, we know that participation in these directed classes has a significant positive impact on those who take part. We are adding two more practical workshops for those who find art or writing too daunting. Our Christmas wreath workshops saw a wide demographic of participants including men and women, young and old, all of whom were delighted to have been able to take part in a festive activity in a safe and welcoming virtual environment.

Will a disadvantaged group benefit from the funding? If so, how?

We aim to address any inequalities by offering our workshops to all those affected by cancer regardless of financial standing or any protected characteristics recognised by equal rights legislation.

How would you intend to inform people you have received funding from the council?

We will publicise receipt of a grant from Lyme Regis Town Council on our website, Facebook page and in our newsletter.

3. What are the main activities in which your organisation is involved?

We host the annual 4-day jazz and blues festival in Lyme Regis over the late May Spring Bank Holiday weekend (28 - 31 May). The festival is run entirely by volunteers and is constituted as an "unincorporated association" with three directors, all of whom live in the town.

We receive no outside funding and rely on ticket sales, traders' fees and voluntary donations for income. Every year we stage 15 hours of free concerts on the seafront over the festival weekend to provide a platform for local musicians and for the benefit of local residents and visitors.

This "community" strand runs alongside ticketed concerts at Marine Theatre, which are self-financing in normal times.

4. Please provide details of the project you require funding for

We are asking LRTC for a modest contribution towards staging the community strand of the festival -15 hours of free music, open to all local residents and visitors.

Normally we finance the free strand of the festival through a combination of collections, traders' pitch fees and any surplus from ticketed concerts. But this year is very different.

We do not expect the same level of income from collections or any surplus from ticket sales because of limited audience numbers due to social distancing requirements. We estimate that projected income will fall by almost 50%. This will leave us with a shortfall in funding for this vital part of the festival.

The extra funding will contribute towards paying performers, sound technicians and hire of equipment.

5. Who will benefit from the project and how?

The community programme will feature local young musicians. Many of them have not had an opportunity to play together, or in front of live audiences, for over twelve months. With the help of BSharp, we will provide these young players with opportunities to perform alongside more experienced professional musicians.

It will also give many local semi-professional and professional musicians an opportunity for paid performances.

It will also give local residents and visitors the opportunity to finally enjoy live music in a covid-secure environment, irrespective of income.

Local residents and visitors will have an opportunity to appreciate the very high standard of musicianship on offer and support local musicians.

6. Will a disadvantaged group benefit from the funding? If so, how?

We hope to widen opportunities for young musicians from the local area, irrespective of income. This is particularly relevant to those playing jazz as there are few opportunities to improve and develop in semi-rural areas like ours compared with other genres of music.

We will also be giving special encouragement to young female jazz players who are currently under-represented.

The free concerts are accessible to all, with seats reserved for the infirm, those with disabilities and young children.

7. How would you intend to inform people you have received council funding?

Through our website (<u>www.jazzjurassica.co.uk</u>) and other social media platforms, printed programme, other ancillary publicity and through acknowledgement during the events.

3. What are the main activities in which your organisation is involved?

Landance animates outdoor spaces in West Dorset with high quality free contemporary dance performances for audiences from all social and cultural backgrounds.

We run free project related workshops in schools and libraries in local communities.

Projects combine skilled professionals with paid emerging artist assistant and associate roles, offering local young people valuable experience and an understanding of possible career pathways.

4. Please provide details of the project you require funding for This project will encourage community cohesion.

Members of the community will come together to share excellent and engaging free live performances on their home patch, seeing their environment through artists eyes and inspiring them to treasure and nurture it. Local young people will gain experience working with professionals thus increasing their employability and confidence. The inter-generational quality of the project encourages sharing working practices and supporting learning as well as facilitating a sense of community within audience members of all ages.

This funding would contribute vital support for a Landance contemporary dance project, Landance in Lyme Regis, 2021, taking place in Lyme Regis this summer. This project involves free workshops in the local community, paid assistant & associate roles for local young artists and free fully accessible public performances along the seafront.

Professionals and local young people will collaborate to create two imaginative and resonant live dance performances in Lyme Regis, focusing on climate change, sense of place and how the two intertwine.

On Thursday 2nd and Friday 3rd September members from the local community in & around Lyme Regis will experience memorable free dance performances along the seafront. With audiences of 350 per performance, the total audience number will be 700.

Three online workshops with the project poet will be run in local schools and for adults, these are being co-ordinated and funded by project partners Dorset Library Service. They will engage over 180 members of the community, young and old, in creating poetry for the project.

Two workshops with the sound artist at the B-sharp Busking Festival will engage 40 local young people, encouraging them to attend one of the free performances with their families.

There will be five paid assistant/associate roles for local young artists. They will assist five skilled professionals in dance, music, poetry, design, producer and event management roles. For a period of 10 days, culminating in two evening performances, the creative team will collaborate on the seafront and in the Marine Theatre, which we will be hiring as a rehearsal space and project base, to create these two inspiring performances.

This project will explore ideas around sense of place, particularly in relation to the experience of climate change in a coastal community. We have developed a relationship with Plymouth University School of Biological and Marine Sciences who are giving us access to their research into Lyme Bay.

These performances will be thought provoking, encouraging a positive and informed approach to this pressing issue. These performances are intended to inspire thoughts of positive action, highlighting the beauty of the coastline and sea and the need to preserve it.

Two local youth dancers from previous Landance projects are key contributors to the research and development of this project. They are assisting the producer throughout the project, acquiring a valuable skill set in creating and producing projects. Their roles will include monthly development meetings, specialising as choreographer and producer/event manager assistants and dance performing roles, thus enhancing their future career prospects by widening their skills base.

A short film will be made to share online. Landance will explore the potential to tour this project next year, tailoring it to Dorset seaside towns, Torbay and Weston-Super-Mare.

These free dance performances will be fully accessible with beach wheelchairs provided if needed. They will be 45 minutes long and will be held in the evening.

Landance co-ordinates with local partners' outreach to attract a wide-ranging audience, reaching members of the community who may not usually attend live performance, with a marketing lead role and marketing plan in place which will be delivered by John Puckey, the experienced marketing manager at The Marine Theatre.

Experienced project and event managers run projects with full budget control, insurance, risk assessment, event management plans and child safeguarding in place.

5. Who will benefit from the project and how?

Members of the local community will benefit, by being able to take part in free online poetry workshops at school and through Lyme Regis Library, also in the free sound workshops at the B-sharp Busking Festival.

Local families can enjoy and experience live dance performance together in their own town, by attending one of the free performances to be held on the seafront in the evening of Thursday 2nd and Friday 3rd September. Landance performances lead the audience along a chosen route, creating a sense of community within the audience and bringing people together.

Local young people will be able to work in paid assistant roles within the project, offering connections with professional practitioners and an understanding of possible career pathways.

6. Will a disadvantaged group benefit from the funding? If so, how?

By running these performances free we are offering low income families the opportunity to attend high quality contemporary dance performances on their doorstep during the summer holidays. Equally they will have the opportunity to take part in the free workshops.

These performances will be fully accessible, with support offered from volunteer stewards and the potential to use a beach wheelchair if needed.

Everyone can attend these free performances which will be widely advertised locally to encourage members of the local community from all walks of life to attend.

We will print posters to put up around town and nearby villages. All of our advertising includes the logos of the organisations supporting the project.

What are the main activities in which your organisation is involved?The BBA's mission statement is as follows:

"To teach men and women to build boats and design and make furniture of the highest quality to accepted industry standards using traditional and modern methods and materials, thus enabling our students to fully realise their potential".

The charity objects are:

- To advance the education of the public in the art, craft and science of boat building, fine woodworking and related skills;
- To educate young people through the provision of sailing or sailing related activities and other training to develop their physical, mental and social capabilities.

Please provide details of the project you require funding for

Adverse Covid impacts have meant that the LRBBA has lost £300,000 in reduced income and unexpected costs to enable it to operate under Covid restrictions, putting the financial viability of the LRBBA and its jobs, at serious risk. Funding is needed to covert first floor accommodation into classroom/workshop space and extend the mezzanine over the ground floor workshop which will help overcome this problem. This will enable students to spread out and recruitment of the full cohort of students, [rather than just 50% at present], with resulting fee income sustaining the business and safeguarding the jobs. The total cost is £63.800+VAT =£76,560 see full breakdown below

Without this work, 2020 losses will persist, damaging further the financial position of the Academy which is an important activity in Lyme Regis with 12 high quality, skilled and stable jobs., skilled and stable jobs that has supported the local economy, for 20 years. DCC's October 2020 Economic Impact Assessment advised that the Academy provides" £1.35 million GVA to the local economy and supports 39 full time equivalent jobs."

It is also important to emphasise that notwithstanding the development of Covid vaccines, given the extensive time that the roll out of the vaccination programme in the UK will take, [which it is understood will extend into 2022], there is still an urgent need for the required works, to keep students socially distanced for the foreseeable future.

Who will benefit from the project and how?

The beneficiaries of the grant will be all the students on all courses offered by the Academy and who at present are barred from attending, due to the space limitations and social distancing requirements. Once the Academy is up to full operations strength, there are further plans to provide a new building in the

courtyard which will enable the BBA to broaden out its work further, with courses designed for the local Lyme Regis and Dorset community, for example, to provide schools with an opportunity to educate pupils about careers in boat building and furniture making, including lectures/discussions with those already working in the industry; notably younger ex-students who could inspire and motivate the next generation.

Will a disadvantaged group benefit from the funding? If so, how?

As noted above, the BBA is also committed to expanding, improving and diversifying the opportunities at the Academy and it aims to target its courses to a more diverse groups of potential students, with the intention of targeting other groups, particularly those from disadvantaged backgrounds, both young people and those who may be having to retrain due to Covid generated redundancies, through the provision of more bursaries. The BBA intends to work with other charities, local authorities, the employment service and housing associations, to target those who may benefit from and be interested in BBA training. The BBA has in the past also attracted a number of ex-service personnel, who may be challenged when they leave the services and are looking for a new career and this will continue.

The aim is also to provide more bursaries and to provide new work opportunities as at present the BBA is able to provide 4 bursaries of 50% fees, to students on both the boat building and furniture making courses. A key objective in the new strategic plan is to secure more external funding, specifically for more bursaries for disadvantaged students and this will be made much easier with the additional space provided.

Since March 2019, we have shopped; collected prescriptions; walked people and their dogs; talked in gardens socially distanced with residents; cleaned out fish ponds and bird aviaries; arranged transport for hospital and medical centre appointments, worked with the medical services, the pharmacies, problem solved, signposted and made 30-40 wellbeing calls weekly, supplied Christmas Lunches to lonely, vulnerable and disabled residents.

More recently, we have made soup. Our volunteers have delivered over 140 portions every fortnight since the beginning of January which we continue to do.

We have plans to continue to develop even better community-building. We are applying to become a CIO to provide more opportunities for our residents to become better connected and engaged in the community, to learn and develop.

4. Please provide details of the project you require funding for During our time volunteering we have found some of our elderly residents have no access to internet services.

We now want to help with more social inclusion by providing laptops and tablets to our residents. We have offers of second hand ones that we can get set back to factory settings and want to purchase new ones to go along with this.

We have plans to continue to develop even better community inclusion. We are applying to become a CIO to provide more opportunities for our residents to become better connected and engaged in the community, to learn and develop. We plan an information source that is physical to run alongside the new online services being provided by Lyme Forward, to ensure all the relevant community groups, local organisations and town and county council services are easily available and accessible to everyone.

Therefore there is a need for a digital inclusion project. Many of the residents we support on a weekly basis have no internet access, computer equipment or Smartphone, so are unable to reach and access services and information.

Once covid restrictions have ended, regular drop-in training sessions on using Smartphones, lap tops and tablets, on accessing services online and on using social media to keep in touch, could be established at the local community centre, as well as one-to-one in people's homes. So, help with purchasing equipment for this project is paramount.

We will still be doing shopping; collecting prescriptions; delivering soups every fortnight for the vulnerable and referring concerns to health and social care teams; signposting and working with other organizations in the town as we have done throughout. Undertaking weekly well-being calls and organising transport. The health and well-being of the people of Lyme Regis will always be our core purpose and we hope to develop the strength and resilience of our community even more in future.

- The elderly community who do not have access to internet facilities and this can help with isolation and social inclusion. We have a resident who didn't think this would be appropriate and that she would be unable to use a tablet and now talks to friends and relations all over the world and we will be prepared to get people to talk to others to show them how it can be achieved and provide instruction

What are the main activities in which your organisation is involved? We utilise the skills of artists to help make society better. Arts and Culture is vital for everyone. It shapes our communities, improves our wellbeing and creatively solves some of our most immediate global issues. We at the Arts Development Company strengthen the arts and culture sector and develop innovative, collaborative and creative solutions that transform people, place and community.

Lyme residents and visitors will continue to benefit from the sculpture trail. We have had so much fantastic feedback and the sculptures are well loved and popular.

In the last year's trail we included an opportunity where the public could engage with the artist, Vicki Westwat whilst she made her piece called 'Tree Pods' on site. Whilst there, she collected feedback from the public:

'It was a great few days I chatted to so many people about the Treepods as well as the other artworks in the trail. I think I must have spoke to nearly one hundred people over the three days. Having an on-site installation really seemed to capture people's imaginations as some people came back day after day to see how I was progressing.

Some lovely quotes from some of people I chatted with, in case you want to feed them back to the town council or funders:

From visitors to the gardens:

'with the current events, its things like chancing upon this sculpture and the others in the park, , that's be lifting my spirits, so please keep doing this'

"This is so positive to see, I have to say seeing public art does make me happy"

"That is beautiful, I love these gardens and trail is just gorgeous "

'With the covid19 restrictions, enjoying outdoor life has been ever more important'

I've also been informed of two beautiful anecdotes:

One army veteran with severe mental health problems, regularly visits *The Reader*. He sits next to her chatting. According to the Park Rangers, this has very much helped the Veteran and he's worried the sculpture will leave.

Another regular visitor to The Reader is a young girl, who gives her a different book to read each time.

The town benefits from the sculpture trail, as when towns invest in culture, it makes that town different from others – it shows that there is care and an interest in making our environments high

The gardens are open to all, so I very much hope all people, including disadvantaged people will utilise them. One lovely story I heard from Pete Williams, Head of Parks for LRTC

There is a Veteran who comes to the park daily to see 'The Reader', one of the sculptures. This man has poor mental health and apparently by visiting this sculpture everyday helps him. A girl also regularly visits the Reader and brings a different book for it, so it can read something different!

The park is free to access, so it is great for everyone regardless of disposable income.

If we could get enough funding we would like to increase the participatory offer, so that disadvantaged groups could work with an artist to make a piece on site.

Last year, part of the programme was for Woodruffe Students to work with the artist on site, ut unfortunately with covid, this was not possible. However we are very keen to re implement this, so that people have an opportunity to learn from artists and participate in creativity.

This work has to be completed by the 31st March 2021 as a condition of the CRF grant. The funding was not sufficient to cover the costs of the interior repairs and redecorations which the Parish is seeking to carry out in Spring 2021. Further funding has been announced by the CRF to which an application has been made; if successful, work has to be completed by 30th June. This application to the Town Council is to seek help towards the costs of the works which comprise;

Raising the profile and increasing knowledge of environmental matters that directly affect residents and visitors to Lyme Regis

TLG is a community environmental group. It meets formally every month and hosts; talks, workshops, films as well as holding community events such as, beach cleans and supporting other organisations events that have a green and Environmental/Sustainability/Community focus.

TLG has a website and sends out regular newsletters.

In 2018 TLG set out to obtain Plastic Free Community status via the Surfers Against Sewage accreditation scheme. This was successfully achieved in June 2018, the 24th in the UK and first in Dorset.

A report on our activities in the 2019/20 has been submitted in our Grants End of Project form.

Please note our submission is based on the assumption that we come out of significant Covid 19 restrictions & is subject to the timing of such and detailed discussions about what may then be possible. It is all provisional at this time.
