3. What are the main activities in which your organisation is involved?

We support anyone who is, or has been, affected by cancer, including relatives and carers, enabling them to cope with the challenges and stresses that this disease imposes. Our individual support is tailored to each person depending on their needs and can include counselling, complementary therapies to relieve symptoms or exercise programmes. We also deliver weekly drop-in sessions where clients can connect with others who share their experiences, worries and concerns and where we can sign-post them to allied services that may better meet their needs (for example, financial help). Our regular workshops provide targeted sessions to promote healthier living and ways to improve physical and mental well-being; examples are fermented foods, mindfulness, sleep and yoga. We also run creative workshops and art sessions where people can express themselves in a non-verbal format. All our support is offered to clients free of charge.

Please provide details of the project you require funding for

Creative activities have a beneficial calming effect on clients, allowing them to focus for a while on an enjoyable task rather than their medical problems and anxieties. For those having suffered a bereavement, they provide a welcome distraction and an introduction to a new activity and new people. These have proved to be hugely popular, so we are increasing the frequency of workshops in the coming twelve months to meet demand. Our floristry workshops can accommodate 20-30 people whilst our creative writing courses, which run for six weeks, are each for six people.

- Creative writing x 6 (£380 per course = £2,240)
- Floristry x 4 (£470 per session = £1,880)

These workshops will be delivered at Lyme Regis Football Club where social distancing can be observed whilst giving clients the opportunity to interact in person.

5. Who will benefit from the project and how?

Anyone who is registered in our community as receiving active cancer care, and their relatives or carers, are eligible to take part in these workshops. It will improve mental well-being and provide a forum to meet other people where thoughts and experiences can be shared in a friendly and understanding environment. From feedback already received from our previous art and creative writing courses, we know that participation in these directed classes has a significant positive impact on those who take part. Our Christmas wreath workshops saw a wide demographic of participants including men and women, young and old, all of whom were delighted to have been able to take part in a festive activity in a safe and welcoming environment.

6. Will a disadvantaged group benefit from the funding? If so, how?

We aim to address any inequalities by offering our workshops to all those affected by cancer regardless of financial standing or any protected characteristics recognised by equal rights legislation.

7. How would you intend to inform people you have received funding from the council?

We will publicise receipt of a grant from Lyme Regis Town Council on our website, Facebook page and in our newsletter.

11. Please provide details of your organisation's fundraising events held in the last two years

Until March 2020, we held regular quiz nights and other fund-raising events including local fairs, jazz nights and coffee mornings. We are only now beginning to resume some of these events. In November 2021 we held an Auction of Promises at Uplyme Village Hall at which over £6,000 was raised.

We have been generously supported by members of our communities with donations given through individuals' fundraising events such as sky diving or in lieu of gifts for an anniversary. We are also seeing a revenue stream returning via our collection pots in local businesses and venues.

Since March 2020, we have relied largely on grant income which we actively seek for all aspects of our services; over £16,000 has been granted so far in this financial year (July 2021 to June 2022). We have seen an increase in income from sales of items such as CDs, greetings cards, recipe books and 2022 calendar which can be purchased through our online shop and select local businesses.

- 3. What are the main activities in which your organisation is involved? All our activities involve bringing people together through Food & Friendship We started with Soup & Soul, delivering around 70 portions of soup per week to Charmouth residents. For many, this was the only physical contact they had with anybody and the doorstep chats were critical. Following on from this, we run Cake & Cuppa where people gather for free cake, drinks and a natter. We will soon be opening The Old School House Cafe - a community cafe Our flagship project is The Seaside Store - see below
- 4. Please provide details of the project you require funding for <u>The Seaside Store aims to combine both food affordability and avoiding food waste. Officially known as a social supermarket, it is a simple but effective, means of easing food stress for many people. It is free to join and members pay £3.50 for 10 items. All fresh fruit, veg, bread & eggs are free and not included in the paid items. Most of our produce is purchased from FareShare, plus we receive donations from local stores and buy food cupboard staples. We operate on a NOT FOR PROFIT basis. As our numbers are growing, we need an extra freezer c£380, plus a label gun to mark up the produce more efficiently c£70.</u>
- 5. Who will benefit from the project and how?

We currently have 160 members which represents 390 people, including children. They don't all come to the store every week, but the numbers attending are growing to such an extent that we may need to increase our food supply, especially given the economic climate of rising inflation and fuel costs. All current and future members will benefit from having access to more food and greater choice.

6. Will a disadvantaged group benefit from the funding? If so, how?

Those who are struggling to make ends meet will benefit. Many of our members are young people with children and they very much appreciate our services.

3. What are the main activities in which your organisation is involved?

We will host the annual 4-day jazz and blues festival in Lyme Regis over the Platinum Jubilee Bank Holiday weekend, Thursday 2 – Sunday 5th June. The festival is run entirely by volunteers and is constituted as an "unincorporated association" with three directors, all of whom live in the town.

We receive no substantial grant support and rely on ticket sales, traders' fees and voluntary donations for income. Every year we stage 15 hours of free concerts on the seafront over the festival weekend. This "community" strand runs alongside ticketed concerts at Marine Theatre.

4. Please provide details of the project you require funding for

We are asking for a financial contribution towards supporting the free community concerts, which this year, will be located in the Performance Area in Marine Shelters. These will take place every afternoon from Thursday 2 June to Saturday 4th June.

Although the concerts are free to the public, they incur costs which include a PA system and backline, services of a sound engineer and performers' fees.

5. Who will benefit from the project and how?

The community programme will benefit:

- local musicians, many of whom have had limited opportunities for paid performances or to play in front of live audiences due to lockdown;
- local residents and visitors will have an opportunity to enjoy the very high standard of musicianship on offer and support local musicians in a safe and friendly environment;
- young musicians will have the opportunity to play alongside and learn from more experienced professional musicians;
- young players will also benefit by learning from their peers and making connections with other young musicians across the county

6. Will a disadvantaged group benefit from the funding? If so, how?

We hope to widen opportunities for young musicians from the local area, irrespective of income – in this area there are few opportunities to improve and develop playing jazz as opposed to other genres of music.

Our programme gives special emphasis to local young female jazz players who are currently under-represented.

3. What are the main activities in which your organisation is involved?

We maintain and operate a croquet lawn at Uplyme for the benefit of residents of Lyme Regis and surrounding area. We have a membership of 26, up by 44% from prepandemic levels. Croquet is a very covid-safe sport and we would like to continue to be able to attract new members. We have two subsidiary lawns which we share with Lyme Regis & Uplyme Cricket Club on the adjacent King George Field.

Please provide details of the project you require funding for.

In late 2020 our lawn was flooded by an overspill of the Lim River. This small stream has long been diverted around the King George Field, originally splitting into two at the upstream side, one course heading east to form the leet that fed the old Waterside Cloth Mill and the other heading south to go along the west side of the King George Field before turning east to reform the Lim River. Since the closure of the leet, the whole flow has taken the southern arm of the stream.

After the serious overspill of autumn 2020, we decided to reinforce the bank with sandbags at its lowest point, a 20 metre stretch on the west side of our lawn. Using voluntary labour by members, donated sandbags, hessian sheeting and grass seed, we raised the bank by about 60 cm. Sadly, our efforts were destroyed by the major flood in late October 2021, which overtopped our bank, destroying nearly all our reinforcements and depositing silt and debris over a large area of our lawn.

We are currently repairing our lawn from our own resources and have temporarily restored some of our flood defences. However, it will not be enough to cope with changing weather patterns in the future.

We are asking for support to obtain better materials to strengthen our flood defences. We plan to drive wooden half round stakes into the bank, lay hessian sandbags in a strong formation against the stakes, back it up with an earthen bank behind the stakes, cover the whole with a layer of soil, planting wild flower and grass seeds chosen for their strong

root systems to stabilise the bank before next winter's storms. We will provide the labour needed if you are able to help with the following materials: Half-round stakes (local sawmill), 1.7m by 12cm, 50 @ £3.56 inc VAT £178 Hessian sandbags (Dickson's), 79 by 33cm, 800 @ 86.4p inc VAT £691 Deep-rooted seed mix 10 kg pack (Meadowmania) £71 Total materials cost £938

Who will benefit from the project and how?

The project will enable us to keep playing on our croquet lawn, protected from the flooding problems that have bedevilled us in the past. Thus the primary beneficiaries will be the members, of whom 37% live in Lyme Regis, 33% in West Dorset and 30% in East Devon. In addition, visitors to Lyme Regis are welcomed to play at the club

6. Will a disadvantaged group benefit from the funding? If so, how?

Most of our members are elderly and some are medically vulnerable. Croquet appeals to them as it is socially distanced and highly covid-safe. Our membership is also open to all comers, regardless of ethnicity, religion, disability (the game can be played from a wheelchair) or gender.

7. How would you intend to inform people you have received funding from the council? We plan to erect a sign on the works themselves, visible from the popular footpath that passes our lawn. We will also put out a press release to announce that we have received the grant. Finally, we will invite council officials and the general public to an open day to celebrate the completion of the works and to invite people to try the game of croquet.

We hold roller skating sessions for over 18's at the Hub Church Street twice a month. We teach roller skating for beginners all the way up to advanced skills. We welcome anyone that would like to join in; membership is optional but is a way of building inclusion. Sessions are open to everyone in the Lyme Regis Community. The club seems to appeal to women (although we are a fully inclusive group) and we have a huge age range join us from 19 to 60 years old. It is heart-warming to see such a diversity of ages of the community together and many attendees have expressed to us the freedom and relief the club provides. Although roller skating is physically demanding, the emphasis is taken off 'getting fit'; it's non-competitive, highly social and a lot of fun, which can be a missing component in otherwise stressful demanding lives especially after the last couple of years we have all experienced.

We try to keep cost of attendance as low as possible so that we can welcome as many people in the community as possible, however one of the obstacles we face is equipment. Currently, we require that our skaters bring all their own equipment including skates and PPE which of course is substantial investment. If they are not quite sure the activity is for them, it can deter people from coming along. What we would love to be able to do is to provide loan roller skates and PPE so that as many people can attend the sessions and try it out until they are able to save for the equipment themselves. We are looking for a contribution of £400 towards 4 sets of skates and PPE.

We try to encourage people who are suffering from loneliness and social isolation to participate and we also work with our local social prescriber to identify such persons. 
